

Maple Leaf Quilt Block

## **Block Fabric Requirements:**

These instructions use two contrasting fabrics. The greater the contrast the more the leaf design stands out. The fabrics used are designated as follows:

**Fabric A** = leaf (2 mottled orange and yellow print fabrics)

**Fabric B** = background (cream solid fabric)

**Fabric C** = stem (mottled brown)

# **Block Size Cutting Chart:**

Here are the unit cutting measurements to make a 6 inch, 9 inch and 12 inch maple leaf block. Simply choose your Block Size and follow the instructions below to make the block.

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# **Piecing and Cutting Instructions in 8 Steps:**


(Use <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" seams)

**Step 1** <u>Make HSTs (half square triangles)</u>: Cut 2 squares each from Fabrics A & B. Mark a diagonal line and then with right sides together, sew <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" on each side of diagonal line. Cut on the diagonal line. Press the seams toward the darker fabric. This makes four HSTs. **Trim** the HSTs.


**Step 2** <u>**Cut Squares and Strip**</u>: From Fabric A, cut 3 squares and from background Fabric B, cut 2 squares. From Fabric C, cut 1 strip.

### Step 3 Make Leaf Stem Piece:


- a) Start with a large square of Fabric B and cut the square in half diagonally from corner to corner.
- b) Insert the strip for the stem between the two triangles. With right sides together, pin the longest (bias) edge of the top triangle to the right-hand edge of the strip. Pin and stitch together.
- c) Finger press the top triangle away from the stem.




d) Pin the second triangle to the stem strip; it is important to align its ends across from those of the first triangle as shown in next diagram. Pin and stitch together.



- e) Finger press the second triangle away from the stem.
- f) Press both seams open.



g) Trim the stem unit by placing the diagonal line of a quilting ruler down the middle of the stem strip and center it. Trim unit to size according to Block Pattern chart (diagram shows trimming the piece from the wrong side).



**Step 4** <u>Lay Out the Block</u>: Near your sewing machine, lay out the block in the format as pictured below. You can see the maple leaf take shape.



Step 5 <u>Sew Piece Units Row by Row</u>: Sew each row together in the layout shown:



**Step 6** <u>**Press the Seams</u>**: Here's a look at the back of the block showing the pieces sewn together and the pressing direction of each seam.</u>



### Step 7 Sew the Rows together

### Step 8 Block Completed: Beautiful!

Once the maple leaf quilt block is all sewn together, take it to the ironing board and give it a final press. Trim the block to size.
