### **COMMITTEE REPORTS** – as per the Executive Committee minutes

- Community Quilt Supply – Lynn Gibson

Attended the Village Quilts annual sale and purchased more fabric for community quilts program. Village Quilts also donated some bolts of flannel that had a wee bit of sun fading, to the guild, for community quilts.

- Community Events – Kaye Borthwick

Kaye expressed her thanks to everyone to volunteered, provided quilts and/or attended the Coyote Flats Pioneer Village quilt show May 18 & 19, 2024.

- Questions arising from the minutes:

\$5.00 increase to membership fee commencing June 1, 2025 – does this require a vote from the membership. No it does not – this is a decision that the Guild Executive Committee can make as part of its role.
